HALL OF FAME



August is Hall of Fame month. In the last two weeks, both the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, Ohio and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York, inducted new classes. The inductees into each of these institutions are greeted with several days of ceremonies, pomp and circumstance, concluding with the actual day of induction. Speeches by the recipients of this honor are sincere (though often formulaic) reminisces of those who helped them achieve

this goal, anecdotes of their experiences, and perhaps some motivational words for those pursuing the same dreams. Another common theme of the "Hall of Fame Weekends" is controversy—usually in regards to those that many think should be inducted but have not at this time. In the case of Cooperstown, that controversy has, in recent memory, been centered upon the game's most prolific hitter.

Pete Rose.

Pete Rose is the reason I grew up loving the game of baseball. From my earliest recollections, I was a Cincinnati Reds fan, having attended several games by the age of 5 or 6. And then I was a Phillies fan. And then an Expos fan. (For those younger than a certain age, the Expos were a major league baseball team. In Montreal. That's in Canada. Now they are the Washington Nationals.)

Yes—an Expos fan in Louisville, Kentucky. And then the triumphant return to Cincinnati as not just a player, but eventually a manager as well. The hit record fell into his hands, and he was bound to become the first UNANIMOUS selection into Cooperstown. Then came the fall. Peter Edward Rose became the sporting symbol of a self-inflicted American tragedy.

The details of that fall are not needed—and in some cases not appropriate—for this space. However, the lessons that can be learned cannot be ignored. From watching Pete Rose, baseball hero, I learned that hustle is not just an attribute, it is a requirement to get every ounce from the talent you are given. I learned that passion can be infectious when witnessed by teammates, coaches, and fans. I learned that competitors are willing to sacrifice for their teams in order to obtain success as a group—he was elected an All-Star at four different positions in his career. I may or may not have learned that replicating Charlie Hustle's head-first slides down grocery store aisles could earn quar-
